## SCINAR

The Section Committee for Improvement of the National Association of Rocketry is an attempt to provide a means for improving the NAR. The members of this committee feel the NAR does not have the means for handling suggestions or sampling the memberships' opinions. This Committee has undertaken to do just that job--to serve as a clearing-house for suggestions and to sample opinions on various questions.

SCINAR publishes a bulletin called SCINAR in which it presents questions and problems to the NAR membership and gives the resulting opinions of previous questions.

The first bulletin has been published and the Committee would like opinions and suggestions on the NAR. Having a convention midway between Nationals. They would also like general suggestions on improving the NAR.

A supplement has been published announcing the opening of nominations for a Trusteeship (NAR). The nominee must be a Senior member of the NAR, must attend NARAM 9, and be willing to serve the three year term. If you wish to nominate someone write a fifty word or less summary of their qualifications and send SCINAR before the deadline of March 12. The election will take place at NARAM 9.

## BYLAWS

A Bylaw is best described as a cross between a motion and a constitutional amendment. Say that you wanted to make basketweaving an activity of our section. You know that a motion won't do because it takes only a simple majority to approve it or to repeal it. you need something more lasting, but you don't feel strong enough about basketweaving to make it a constitutional amendment. Soon you can make basketweaving a Bylaw, (if you get enough votes).

A Bylaw uses the same procedure as a constitutional amendment but it takes only a 2/3 majority of the voting membership instead of the 3/4 required for a constitutional amendment.

Bylaws should be proposed soon. So be prepared for the debates.

## ZIG, ZAG, ZOG?

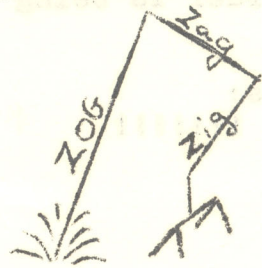

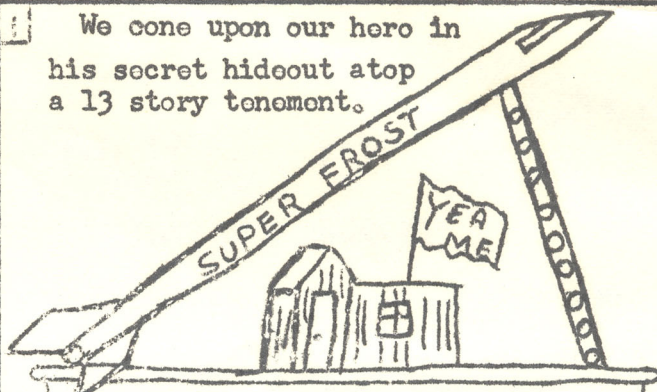

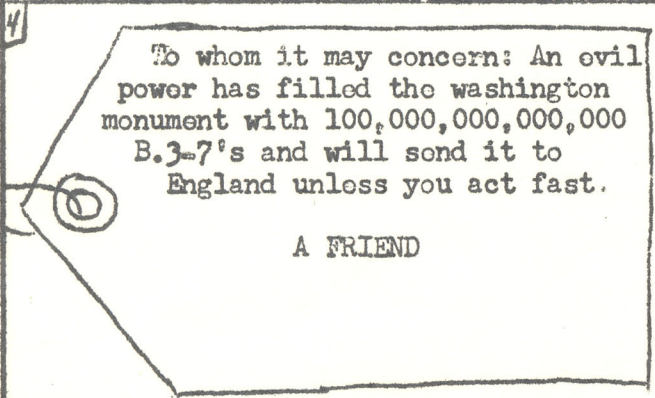

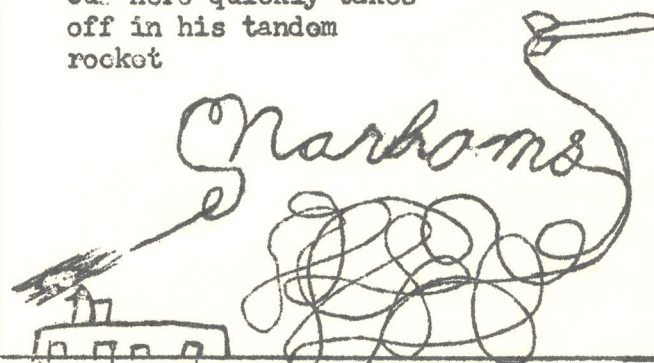

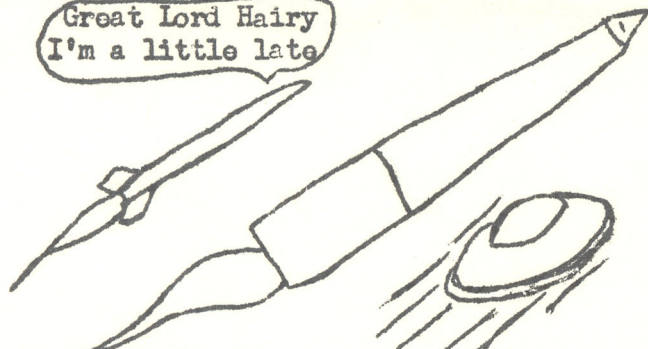

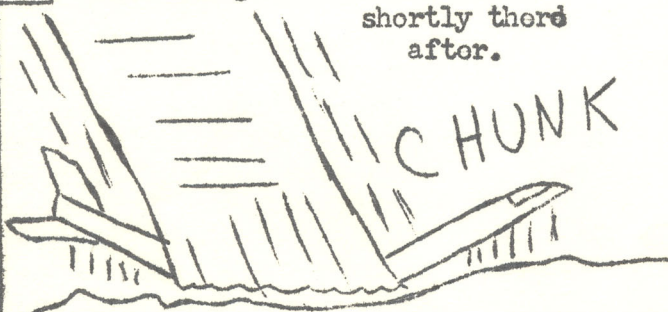


Will our hero recover the stolen Monument? (I doubt It).

8 The Washington Monument landed shortly there after.

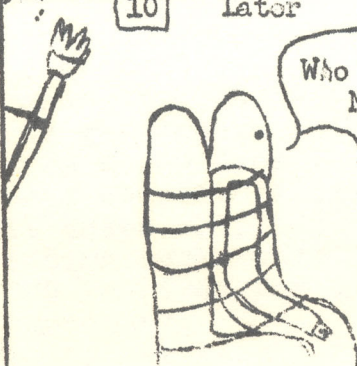


9 Our hero sets out exploring the Barrow. SUDDENLY...
